

Co-producing research and change: An introduction to participatory (action) research methods



Participatory (action) research is an approach to research in which researchers partner with community stakeholders and research participants, with the aim to collaboratively combine knowledge development and action towards social change. Goal is to conduct research with people, rather than on people or for people. We will explore 3 topics: 1) key principles and concepts related to participatory research (e.g. participation, citizen science, co-productive research methods) 2) possible challenges in doing participatory research (e.g. questions on power, ethics), and 3) creative strategies for collecting and analysing the data in a participatory approach.
